H A Z E L B A K E R

-written 20 June 1933 -
author unknown -

During the Revolutionary War about the year of 1778 while the officers of the Duke of Brunswick, the Land Grave of the Hess Cassal, the hereditary Prince of Cassal, the Court of Hannan was drafting a regiment of Grenadiers for the King of England, George III. PETER HAZELBAKER¹ was standing in the crowd of spectators when he was called to step across the street and commended to step under the Standard. He measured six foot one and three-fourths in height, black eyes and hair and dark complected. He was a little too tall, but the officer said he "would do". He was 18 or 19 years old and said to be the only son of his mother, a widow. This happened at Auspach, Province of Bavaria, Germany. England paid for each soldier a subsidy of 7 pounds, four shillings, fourpence, and twice that for all who were killed.

When Peter Hazelbaker came to America from Auspach, Germany, he was an English soldier. During the Revolution he was taken prisoner at Yorktown, when Lord Cornwallis surrendered. When the exchange of prisoners took place, Peter was hidden in the barn of one Daniel Shively of Berkley Co., Va. now W.Va. and was never exchanged. Peter married Elizabeth, daughter of the above named Shively and settled nearby. Here was born to him six sons: John; Peter; Daniel; Abraham; George and Jacob. One nite while in bed, he was bitten by a spider. The doctor sent for, was drunk and gave him medicine which, though it saved his life, left him paralyzed. Sometime later with his family - Peter and wife moved to Washington County, Pennsylvania settling in Allen Twp. in a log house on the S.A. Chester farm. He died in 1800 at about the age of (58) and was buried in a field just above the present residence of Major Henry Sphar.

5. GEORGE (W.) HAZELBAKER² (Peter¹), b. 18 Jan. 1790, Berkley Co., Va. now W.Va. - died 24 July 1879, Washington Co., Pa. He lived beyond all his brothers. He married Matilda Dunlevy, a sister to Andrew Dunlevy. She died 18 Oct. 1852, 59 years old - buried in Speers Cemetery. Her mother was a Crawford and a cousin to Col. Crawford who was burnt at the stake by the Indians in what is now Crawford Co., Ohio. Her father was of Irish descent. George, after his marriage, erected the lower part of the old Laneheart house on Main Street, Belle Vernon, Pa. where stood the residence of Mrs. Amanda Jobes. In this house George first set-up house-keeping and there carried on a hat business, until he and his brother-in-law, Andrew Dunlevy (son of Anthony and Mary Cook Dunlevy), manufactured hats. It was truly a manufactory as all the work was done by hand power, and also by candlelight as no other lights were known at that time. They not only made the popular wool hats of that time, but also the fine fur hats, the wool hat done a boy an undesirable long service there seemed to be no wear-out to it as it was the custom at that time to iron over and shape a new hat whenever it became discolored or presented an unseemingly appearance.

The fine fur hat was also subjected to a renovating process that made it good as ever. This firm was the market for rabbit and mink skins from which the fine fur hat was manufactured. Caps and mufflers so called were made from Coon and Fox skins with the tails as ornamental appendages.

GEORGE W. HAZELBAKER, con't

Andrew Dunlevy, born 24 July 1795 - died 24 July 1879 and is buried in the old Speers Cemetery. The mother of Andrew and Matilda was a Crawford, sister of the wife of Col. Edward Cook. The wife of Andrew, Mary (d. 1845) was the daughter of Elder Wm. Jackman, the father of the late Jehu Jackman (d. 17 Dec. 1876, 86 yrs. old - his tombstone bears the Masonic Emblem - burial in Mt. Tabor Cemetery) and Sineon Jackman.

George Hazelbaker resided on the John B. Gould farm above town then he moved to the Levi Johnson farm, then later the Rutan, then owned by J.W. Manown. He then removed to the Cooper farm near Maple Creek. At that time all the ground where the town of Charleroi now stands could be bought for 25 cents an acre, but our Grandfathers in those days worked for 3 shillings (37½¢) a day; shouldered their ax in the dead of winter and cut, piled, and burn't logs to make potash salts and sold for cash to meet their debts to the State. We should be devoutly thankful that we do not have to get up tomorrow and look out on the world that daily greeted our Grandfather one hundred years ago. Finally in the year 1841 he purchased a farm on which he died in Allen Twp. from Abia Allen and Robert Stockdale, now the home of his granddaughter, Mrs. Melissa Pringle.
